CLASS MYSTERY PRIZE COMPETITION: The school operates a Class Mystery Prize Competition reward program, where classes receive reward tokens for displaying appropriate behaviours in and out of the classroom. Last Friday, the Yr 1 and Yr 4/5 class had received the most tokens and earnt the right to pick one of twenty prizes from the Mystery Prize wall. The Yr 2 class was lucky enough to pick a free dress day for the whole class, which they enjoyed yesterday. The Yr 4/5 class picked ten minutes extra recess. The big prize, a free pizza lunch for the class, was not picked this time. The competition has now reset for the next two weeks.

SCIENCE LABORATORY UPDATE: The Italian room will be converted into a purpose built science laboratory during the coming holidays. The room will receive a new water trough, benches along the walls, vinyl flooring and storage cupboards. The school also has \$35 000 to purchase furniture and equipment, which will include a new interactive panel and a 3D printer. Everyone is looking forward to having Science in the new laboratory.

A Few Reminders

STAFF CAR PARK: A number of parents are using the staff car park to drop off or collect children. This is a very dangerous practice. The school has had serious accidents in the past involving parents reversing their cars in the staff car park. **Please do not use the staff car park to drop off or collect students**. There is ample parking available in the car parks across Jones Street. Why not park there and walk across with the assistance of our crossing warden? If you have a reason why you need to use the staff car park please make an enquiry at the front office. The disabled bays under the shelter are for ACROD parking permit holders only.

KISS AND DRIVE: The 'Kiss and Drive' bays are situated at the front of the school on Rickman Street, outside the library. This is so your children can wait in the shade, on benches outside the library. Please ensure these bays are used correctly. The last four bays on Rickman Street should only be used to drop off and pick up children while you are still in the car. There is also a one minute limit with these bays. Parents parking and leaving their cars for more than one minute risk a fine. The other bays along Rickman Street, have a 15 minute time limit between the hours of 7.30 - 9.00am and 2.30 and 4.15pm Again, there is ample parking available in the car parks across Jones Street.


