PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE: There have been a lot of changes over the past three weeks. At the end of last term, all schools were busy preparing for the delivery of distance education. Schools were to remain open, but only for the children of essential workers or those who could not be at home. Takari staff worked tirelessly to develop programs of work that they could work through with their students on-line. This was a steep learning curve for many staff, but they all rose to the challenge and, in the end, were all looking forward to deliver their new programs when the new term commenced.

The low level of transmission of COVID-19 in Western Australia is great news and everyone is thankful that we haven't had to experience what others have in other countries. The news late in the holidays that some restrictions were being relaxed was welcomed by most people.

The State Government's position on schools also changed, and parents and carers were given the choice of whether children returned to school or accessed distance education from home. There were also a number of conditions placed on schools, including parents not being permitted on the school site and additional cleaning throughout the school day.

With 75% of Takari students returning to school this week, the school has had to reassess the delivery of programs. Class teachers have had to go back to their classrooms for normal face-to-face teaching. Distance education is still available to students at home, but teachers are now no longer able to support students to the extent that was originally planned. Class teachers have been designated times throughout the week when they are available to assist students and families with their distance education. This isn't what staff had initially planned for, but we are all learning to be flexible and responsive in an ever changing world.

All the staff, from the cleaners and office staff to the education assistants and teachers, have done an amazing job navigating the many changes and extra workloads that have been forced upon them. I am very confident that the Takari students are receiving the very best education possible. And the parents and carers have been so supportive and understanding with everything. Everyone is doing the best they can in this very unique and challenging situation. We really do have an amazing school community.

For me, all the hard work was worthwhile when I stood at the front entrance yesterday and saw the enormous smiles on all the students' faces as they walked, skipped and ran down the path to their classrooms. Everyone was so happy to be back at school. Let's keep our fingers crossed that the good news continues.

Please remember the following:

- No students at school before 8.30am as supervision cannot be guaranteed.
- Parents are asked not to enter onto the school site unless prior permission has been granted. You can contact the school on phone 9253 4550 or email <u>Takari.PS@education.wa.edu.au</u> and make an appointment to come on the school site.
- <u>Kindergarten</u>: Drop students off at the Jones Street staff car park between 8.40am and 8.50am and pick up between 2.40pm and 2.50pm.
- Pre-Primary: Drop students off at the Jones Street staff car park between 8.30am and 8.40am. Pick up at the normal 3.00pm home time.
- Yr 1 to Yr 6: Drop off and pick up students at small gate on Jones Street (near traffic warden) or the front Rickman Street entrance.
- Two cleaners will be on site between 6.30am and 5.30pm, and will work throughout the day to ensure all high-use areas and play equipment are regularly cleaned and disinfected.
- Students will still be <u>encouraged</u> to maintain social distancing practises when practical.
- Assemblies, excursions, incursions and interschool activities will not be conducted until further notice.
- Soap is available in all toilets and hand sanitiser is available in all classrooms.
- Students who are unwell are to remain home.
- The BKC before and after school care program will operate, but parents are not permitted on the school site.



Chaplains Check-in - Week T2 2020

Good afternoon Takari.

Feeling connected and being connected is part of our human survival mechanism and is vital for our mental and emotional health. We reconnect this month having been separated from each other, our families and friends quite unexpectedly, and some have re-connected in new ways. But it's now deemed safe for us to once again connect with our school face to face. That being said, it's not always easy to let our children go if they (and us) are a little unsure of things.

With this in mind, I've found a few tips that might help you and your children.

We're all looking forward to getting stuck into the learning, playing and connecting – just second nature for anyone at Takari!

Keep sending your child to school: avoiding situations that make us feel wor-

ried can make the worry worse next time.

Acknowledge that it is tricky but with practice it becomes easier and...

Leave them <u>quickly</u> – even if they're up set, even if you're upset. Teachers can manage your child once they are at school. Most children recover quickly once they're back in the class. Lots of detail can be calming:

talk them through their day: where you will drop them off and pick them up – especially with the new routine.

Praise brave <u>behaviour</u>: Tell your child how proud you are they went to rschool and ask them what good things happened at school.

Reflect on how you are feeling.

Kids pick up on their parent's emotions very easily. Modelling calm behaviour and tone of voice can really help.


