WA Education Awards 2021

We are fortunate to have many outstanding staff at Takari PS, who are extremely competent, passionate and dedicated to providing students the best educational opportunities to help students grow and achieve their best.



The Minister for Education announced the opening of the 2021 WA Education Awards last week. These awards acknowledge individuals who demonstrate leadership, innovation and community spirit, and are an exciting opportunity to celebrate school communities. All staff at the school are eligible to be nominated - Cleaners, Gardeners, Library Officers, School Officers, Managers Corporate Services, Education Assistants, Teachers (there is also a Beginning Teacher category), Deputy Principals or Principals. Nominations must come from a Department of Education employee, or School Council chair or P&C president.

The Takari Primary School Council and P&C are very keen to acknowledge the amazing staff we have at the school. The School Council is now asking for parents to **acknowledge** a staff member for their **outstanding contribution to shaping the future of education**. All School Councillor representatives and P&C members have acknowledgement cards (sample provided above) to give to interested parents. A template for the acknowledgement card will be sent out to all families via School Star, and cards are also available from the front office.

Parents are asked to complete and return acknowledgement cards to the front office drop box no later than Thursday 3 June. Acknowledgement cards can also be handed to School Council representatives and P&C members.

Mr Fu (School Council chair) and Mrs Praetz (P&C president) will meet after 3 June to collate the acknowledgement cards and determine whether to complete a formal nomination for a staff member or members. All staff receiving acknowledgements will be presented with their cards and a letter of thanks from Mr Fu and Mrs Praetz.

Playing our part to build a national picture of child health

In early 2021, our school, along with thousands of others across the country will begin preparations for the fifth Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC gives us a national picture of the development, health and wellbeing of children in their first year of full-time school. Since 2009, the census results have helped communities, schools and governments plan services and develop better policies to target support for children and families.

Children don't miss any class time, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information for the census. The AEDC gives us data at a school and community level - it isn't an assessment of individual children.

Some teachers have also noticed that completing the assessments made them more aware of the needs of individual children and the class as a whole and that the census results are useful in planning for transitions to Year 1 and developing class programs.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary.

Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.

We will also be running the annual Balcatta Buzz/ Takari Primary Halloween Event, which was a huge success last year and this year we are looking to make it bigger and better.


















Schools Make Music Concert at the Crown Theatre
