

WAGSMS have allocated a date for our performance in the 2021 concert series.


Thursday night 12 August (Week 4 of Term 3)

There will also be a rehearsal during the day. More details will follow as soon as we have received ticket purchasing information. Please record the date and watch out for the note coming soon.



