
# NAIDOC WEEK AT TAKARI PS








There has been a whole lot going on in Science over the last couple of weeks!

- Pre primary have been dissolving "moon rocks" and making rainbows with bicarb soda.
- Year 1/2 have made some fabulous water saving posters and they also made rainbows with bicarb and food colouring.
- The Year 2/3 and 3/4 classes studied rocks and tested the absorbency of 3 different soil types.
- The Year 4/5 and 5/6 classes have been simulating flood situations, they have built houses with and without stilts and tested them by making it "rain".

All classes have been learning how to program some of our fabulous robots. The Edisons, Dot and Dash and Bee Bots have been allowed out of the science cupboard this term.





Safety & Hygiene Practices (COVID-19 Impact)

We are putting in place extra hygiene and safety practices to ensure all our participants, families and staff members stay safe and healthy. Below outlines the practices we will be implementing to ensure we operate in a safe and controlled environment.

- Spectators, including parents and guardians, are asked to drop off and pick up children in the time periods outlined on the activity schedule. We ask that this is done promptly and without delay in our venues, to support social distancing practices.
- Hand sanitisers will be available in prominent places throughout our venues and all participants in the program are encouraged to use it before and after each sport activity throughout the day.
- Sharing of sporting equipment will be limited, and all equipment used in activities will be cleaned and disinfected.
- Activities will be located across multiple venues in an openspaced setting, whereby limiting the amount of people in confined areas.
- The program will operate in a cashless environment, where no cash handling will take place at the UWA Recreation and Fitness Centre.
- Designated toilet facilities will be assigned to the program for children use only.
- All children, parents/guardians and staff attending the program MUST NOT ATTEND if they: have any flu-like symptoms; have been in direct contact with a known case of COVID-19 in the past 14 days; have travelled internationally or have been in direct contact with a known case of COVID-19 in the past 14 days, and/or are at a high risk from a health perspective, including the elderly and those with pre-existing medical heath conditions.


