It is important as many parents and carers attend the Protective Behaviours workshop, as it will provide them with information and strategies that can be used at home. 
This fortnight Team Takari has focused on the Start and End of the Day Procedures.

FREE PROTECTIVE BEHAVIOURS WORKSHOP for Parents and Carers

At Takari, we believe that **all children have the right to feel safe at all times** but we also know as parents, carers and teachers, we cannot be with each child every minute of the day.

The physical and emotional impact of bullying, cyber bullying, child abuse and domestic violence is now much better understood. Research consistently shows that teaching children preventive ways of staying safe, such as those described in the Protective Behaviours program, is an effective way of strengthening children's ability to recognise danger, seek help and minimise risk.

Takari is committed to teaching every child the Protective Behaviours program in partnership with you. Parents and carers play a vital role in helping children develop personal safety and resilience skills and it's very important children hear the same messages at school and home. Working together, we can help our children to recognise unsafe situations and be proactive and confident in their response.

All Takari staff will be completing three hours of Protective Behaviours professional learning over the next three weeks, in readiness for a whole school Protective Behaviours focus in the classrooms.

Parents and carers are also offered a two hour Protective Behaviours workshop. By attending this workshop, parents will:

- learn the key principles of the Protective Behaviours program
- understand the positive impact of the Protective Behaviours program for children
- discuss how the protective behaviours program is being taught at school and practise activities and ways to speak with your child at home about personal safety that aligns with what they have learnt at school.

Our school photo day is coming! This week, every student received their Kapture Photography order envelope to bring home. The recommended method of ordering your photos is online through Kapture's website as your payment is secure and can be easily verified at any time. If you pay online, there is no need to return the order envelope to school.

Alternatively you can pay by cash and return the provided envelope to the school on the photography day. Please note the photographers cannot open sealed envelopes and cannot provide change.

Late payment envelopes cannot be accepted by the school office or by Kapture. You can place an order online at any time for the remainder of the current school year however a \$15 fee will apply if you order more than 10 days after photography.

If your child is in a special group photo, you can use the same school code on your order envelope to view and order these photos on Kapture's website, around the time that school photos are ready to be delivered.

Please note; Class group, individual and sibling portraits are not available to view online.

Kapture offer a money back guarantee for any parent who is not fully satisfied with their photo package. Should you have any queries before or after photo day, please direct them to the Kapture office on 9240 1714 or email enquiries@kapture.com.au.



PARKING AND TRAFFIC AROUND THE SCHOOL

STAFF CAR PARK: A number of parents are using the staff car park to drop off or collect children. This is a very dangerous practice. The school has had serious accidents in the past involving parents reversing their cars in the staff car park. **Please do not use the staff car park to drop off or collect students**. There is ample parking available in the car parks across Jones Street. Why not park there and walk across with the assistance of our crossing warden? If you have a reason why you need to use the staff car park please make an enquiry at the front office. The disabled bays under the shelter are for ACROD parking permit holders only.



KISS AND DRIVE: The 'Kiss and Drive' bays are situated at the front of the school on Rickman Street, outside the library. This is so your children can wait in the shade, on benches outside of the library. Please ensure these bays are used correctly. The last four bays on Rickman Street should only be used to drop off and pick up children while you are still in the car. There is also a one minute limit with these bays. Parents parking and leaving their

cars for more than one minute risk a fine. The other bays along Rickman Street, have a 15 minute time limit between the hours of 7.30 - 9.00am and 2.30 - 4.15pm

USING THE CROSSING WARDEN: The school is fortunate to have the services of a crossing warden. Unfortunately, it has been reported many children (and parents) are not utilising this service and crossing at the roundabout or near the oval, both less than 40 metres from the official crossing. Please use the services of the Cross Walk man to ensure the safety of your children.




Community Notices

HEAD LICE/NITS: It has been reported that nits have been present in students at Takari Primary School. Please check your child's hair tonight for nits/lice and if you find any nits or lice commence treatment.

What if I find head lice?

- Check to see if anyone else living in your house has head lice – use the hair conditioner method.
- Choose the <u>treatment method</u> that best suits you and your family and follow the instructions carefully.
- Inform your school, child care centre, playgroup, neighbours and relatives so that other children and adults who have been in close contact can be checked.




When the treatment is completed and all head lice and eggs have been removed, continue to check hair weekly for further outbreaks.

Stay Home From School

Under the *School Education Act 1999*, if your child has head lice, the principal may keep him or her away from school until treatment has started.

Your child may return to school when all live head lice have been removed. There is no need to stay away from school if there are only a few remaining eggs, but you must continue treatment over the following 10 days to ensure that all eggs and hatchlings have been removed.
