Communication and interaction between the school and home is encouraged. The following themes will be covered over the next two weeks.

Term 4 Week 1	Theme #3 <u><b>SAFETY CONTINUUM</b></u>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Safety involves having informed choice and control over any situation in which we find ourselves</li> <li>• Feeling safe and adventurous go hand in hand when we maintain our choice and control. Each of us has experienced feeling safe and unsafe and these situations may be quite unique to the individual.</li> <li>• Recognising the difference between feeling safe and unsafe is a crucial part of the protective behaviours program.</li> </ul>	
Term 4 Week 2	Theme #4 <u><b>SAFE AND UNSAFE SECRETS</b></u>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Safe secrets usually have a happy outcome, are kept for a short time and are always told eventually.</li> <li>• Unsafe secrets are usually about actions or behaviours that are unsafe or dangerous. They may make us feel afraid, upset, confused, embarrassed, anxious or unsafe.</li> <li>• Unsafe secrets can involve a threat that something bad will happen if you tell.</li> </ul>

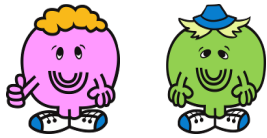

### PARKING AND TRAFFIC AROUND THE SCHOOL

**STAFF CAR PARK:** A number of parents are using the staff car park to drop off or collect children. This is a very dangerous practice. The school has had serious accidents in the past involving parents reversing their cars in the staff car park. **Please do not use the staff car park to drop off or collect students.** There is ample parking available in the car parks across Jones Street. Why not park there and walk across with the assistance of our crossing warden? If you have a reason why you need to use the staff car park please make an enquiry at the front office. The disabled bays under the shelter are for ACROD parking permit holders only.



**KISS AND DRIVE:** The 'Kiss and Drive' bays are situated at the front of the school on Rickman Street, outside the library. This is so your children can wait in the shade, on benches outside of the library. Please ensure these bays are used correctly. The last four bays on Rickman Street should only be used to drop off and pick up children while you are still in the car. There is also a one minute limit with these bays. Parents parking and leaving their cars for more than one minute risk a fine. The other bays along Rickman Street have a 15 minute time limit between the hours of 7.30 - 9.00am and 2.30 - 4.15pm.

**USING THE CROSSING WARDEN:** The school is fortunate to have the services of a crossing warden. Unfortunately, it has been reported many children (and parents) are not utilising this service and crossing at the roundabout or near the oval, both less than 40 metres from the official crossing. Please use the services of the Cross Walk man to ensure the safety of your children.

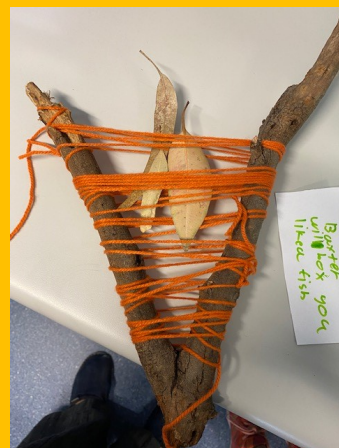
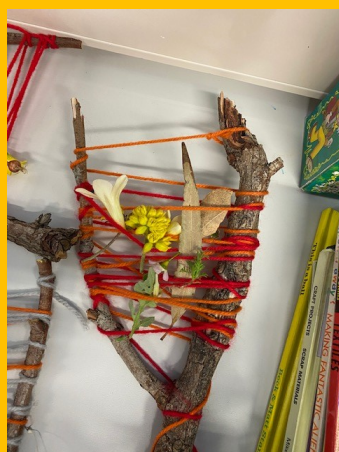




Congratulations to the Year 1 students who have completed Level 1 of the Minilit program.
