PARKING AND TRAFFIC AROUND THE SCHOOL

STAFF CAR PARK: A number of parents are using the staff car park to drop off or collect children. This is a very dangerous practice. The school has had serious accidents in the past involving parents reversing their cars in the staff car park. **Please do not use the staff car park to drop off or collect students**. There is ample parking available in the car parks across Jones Street. Why not park there and walk across with the assistance of our crossing warden? If you have a reason why you need to use the staff car park please make an enquiry at the front office. The disabled bays under the shelter are for ACROD parking permit holders only.



KISS AND DRIVE: The 'Kiss and Drive' bays are situated at the front of the school on Rickman Street, outside the library. This is so your children can wait in the shade, on benches outside of the library. Please ensure these bays are used correctly. The last four bays on Rickman Street should only be used to drop off and pick up children while you are still in the car. There is also a one minute limit with these bays. Parents parking and leaving their

cars for more than one minute risk a fine. The other bays along Rickman Street have a 15 minute time limit between the hours of 7.30 - 9.00am and 2.30 - 4.15pm.

USING THE CROSSING WARDEN: The school is fortunate to have the services of a crossing warden. Unfortunately, it has been reported many children (and parents) are not utilising this service and crossing at the roundabout or near the oval, both less than 40 metres from the official crossing. Please use the services of the Cross Walk man to ensure the safety of your children.



Science Week News

Last week we celebrated National Science Week at Takari. The theme for 2021 was Food: Different by Design. The PP and Year 1 children designed, made and ate fruit kebabs. Apparently, the BEST science lesson ever! Years 2/3 - 3/4 experimented with purple cabbage, and used lemon juice and bicarb soda to change the colour and PH levels.

Years 4/5 - 5/6 discussed and then created bioplastics using milk & vinegar, corn starch & water, and glucose & water. We will test them this week.

In Technologies, we are planning to use the 3D printers this term to start printing some name plates for the older classes. The younger children will have STEM tower building and Lego challenges.

We have been very lucky to welcome not one, but two CSIRO STEM Partners to our school. A big welcome to Alex Petty and Rosie Allen.

Alex is a Geo Engineer and he is the dad of Isaac in Year 2. Rosie is an Engineer.

Both of our scientists came and helped with the bioplastics experiments during Science Week.

The STEM Partners in Schools is a terrific initiative run by CSIRO to bring real science into the classrooms.


