PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE: Congratulations to the P&C on their very successful Colour Run event last Friday. The students danced their way through five Jump Jam songs before heading to the oval where they were squirted with water and coated in coloured powder. It was difficult to recognise the students when they had finished! Thank you to all the parents who assisted on the day. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed themselves and over \$3 000 was raised, which is going towards a new swing set to be installed in Joel Park very soon.







The school trialled a 'lunch before recess' timetable over the last two weeks. Students from Yr 1 to Yr 6 went out to play for 25 minutes at 11:00am, before eating their lunch and then returning to classrooms at 11:40am. There was also a 20 minute recess break at 1:10pm.

Staff reported the new timetable worked well. Students quickly adapted to the new times and were observed to be much more settled entering the classroom after eating something substantial at 11:30am instead of the previous 1:00pm time. The students themselves thought the new timetable was good.

I am very keen to hear from parents about the trial. Were the children hungry straight after school? Did they have a better appetite at dinner time? Was there no difference? Please feel free to email the school or talk to the classroom teachers. All feedback will be passed on to the School Council and a determination will be made as to whether the new timetable is adopted permanently next year. The school will revert back to the normal timetable, with recess at 11:00am and lunch at 12:50pm, for the remainder of the year.




