TAKARI PRIMARY SCHOOL

Takari is the Aboriginal meaning for 'Tomorrow'. Established in 1969, Takari Primary School is located in the northern suburbs of Perth in the Balcatta area. We cater for students from Kindergarten to Year 6. With an approximate population of 180 students, we are a small school where every child is known and valued.

Takari offers specialist programs in Music, Physical Education and Italian. The Music program includes two rock bands that perform at special events. After school sporting clinics are also offered each term. All classes at Takari have up to date interactive panels and wireless internet. Classes have access to sets of laptop computers and iPads, which are used regularly across all curriculum areas.

The school has four main teaching blocks within the main building infrastructure, a spacious air conditioned library and a large enclosed undercover area. Recent upgrades include the conversion of the old library to a dedicated Science Laboratory and three new basketball/netball courts. A recent maintenance program ensured all classrooms received new carpet, paint, pinup/white boards.

The Takari School Council meets regularly and actively contributes to the preparation and ratification of policy documents and management plans, and monitor the school's financial position. The P&C, a small but dedicated group of volunteers, have undertaken many fundraising events to help improve the school's resources. In 2021, funds raised by the P&C were used to purchase a portable stage for performances and a new swing set in Joel Park.

PROFILE

In 2021, Takari Primary School employed a total of thirty one teaching and non teaching staff. The staff bring considerable experience and stability to the school with many being employed at Takari for more than ten years. All teaching staff meet the professional requirements to teach in Western Australian schools and are registered with the Teacher Registration Board.

ENROLMENT TRENDS

2021 STUDENT COUNCIL

The position of Student Councillor is highly sought after at Takari Primary School. Seventeen of the nineteen Year 6 students nominated for the Student Council and delivered speeches in front of the school community. Staff and students from Year 5 and Year 6 then voted for their preferred representatives. The speeches were all of a high standard and voting for the six available positions was very close.

In 2021, the Student Councillors focused on promoting the school's four core behaviours of Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Personal Best. They were responsible for organising free dress days to support local charities, assisting on National Tree Day and being spokespeople for the school at special activities and events. The Student Council also delivered daily messages across the public address system.

Respect At Takari, we treat everyone with dignity, compassion and consideration.


Responsibility

2021 GRADUATING CLASS




2021 NAPLAN PERMORMANCE

All students in Year 3 and Year 5 participated in the National Assessment Program in Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). Although the NAPLAN assessments can be narrow in their coverage, they are regarded as the best tool currently available for comparing students and schools across Australia. NAPLAN results can also be used to track the progress of individual students, year group cohorts and the whole school. Takari's achievement is compared against other Western Australian schools. Takari aims to be at or above these schools in Year 3 and to show positive cohort progress from Year 3 to Year 5.


NAPLAN assessment were not undertaken in 2020 due to the disruption to teaching and leaning caused by COVID-19. In 2021, the NAPLAN format changed from pencil and paper to an on-line platform. Year 5 students completed all assessments on the school's laptops. The Year 3 students used the school's iPads for all but the Writing assessment, which was completed with pencil and paper.

The school continued to assess students in Progressive Assessment Tests (PAT), which was first adopted in 2020 as an alternative the NAPLAN assessments that were not conducted that year. The school will use and report PAT achievement and progress in 2022, when there will be three years of data.




The Year 3 cohort mean score in Numeracy was slightly above the WA mean score. This is consistent with the cohort's On-Entry Assessments conducted when the students were in Pre-primary. The general trend over the past six years has been positive.

The Year 5 cohort mean score in Numeracy was slightly below the WA mean score, but still within the expected range. The cohort's two year progress, from when they were in Yr 3, is good. The school's Year 5 achievement has been consistent over the past six year.




The Year 3 cohort mean score in Reading was slightly above the WA mean score. This is consistent with the cohort's On-Entry Assessments conducted in when the students were in Pre-primary. The general trend over the past six years has been positive.

The Year 5 cohort mean score in Reading was below the WA mean score. The general trend over the past six years has been inconsistent, although there has been positive trend over the last two years. Reading will continue to be a focus.




The Year 3 cohort mean score in Writing was below the WA mean score, but still within the expected range. This is consistent with the cohort's On-Entry Assessments conducted when the students were in Pre-primary. The general trend over the past six years has been consistent.

The Year 5 cohort mean score in Writing was above the WA mean score. The cohort's two year progress, from when they were in Year 3, was very good. The general trend over the past six years has been positive.



The Year 3 cohort mean score in Spelling was slightly below the WA mean score. The general trend over the past six years has been consistent.

The Year 5 cohort mean score in Spelling was slightly below the WA mean score, but still within the expected range. The cohort's two year progress, from when they were in Year 3, was very good. The school's Year 5 achievement has been inconsistent over the past six year, although trending up over the past two years.



The Year 3 cohort mean score in Grammar was similar to the WA mean score. The general trend over the past six years has been positive.

The Year 5 cohort mean score in Grammar was below the WA mean score, but still within the expected range. The general trend over the past six years has been inconsistent, although there has been a positive trend over the last two years.

PARENT SATISFACTION SURVEY

All schools are required to conduct parent satisfaction surveys every two years. Parents' views of Takari in 2020 were very positive. The school maintained its high level of satisfaction for 2021. The level of satisfaction has increased by 15% in the past six years from 2014. The seven highest scoring questions are highlighted in blue below.

Questions where satisfaction levels increased by more than 15% over the past six years are highlighted in blue. Most significantly: *I am satisfied with the overall standard of education at this school*Increased from 68% to 90%
