The past two weeks have continued to be super busy at Takari with many celebratory events. Last night, for the first time in many years the End of Year Concert was conducted on the oval. It was a spectacular display of entertainment from the Takari students and an opportunity to recognise the achievements of students. We had our final Assembly for 2022 with the talented Takari musicians, 2023 Kindergarten students and their families visited the school for the Kindergarten Transition Morning, and auditions for the much anticipated 'Takari's Got Talent' have also been completed. It looks like a fantastic line up for next week's student show. The troublesome Takari Elf has also returned to get up to mischief around the school and been named Ratatouille for 2022.

On Monday 12 December, we formally farewell the current Year 6 Graduates. Preparations are in full swing for the annual and auspicious Graduation Assembly and Dinner Dance. We wish our 2022 Graduates the very best for high school and the future.

The 2022 Yearbook has arrived and is a great keepsake of memories from primary school. Pre-ordered copies are available for collection by parents in the office. There are also a number of copies still available for purchase.

Our 2023 enrolments currently stand at 190 students. The school is planning to operate the following structure.  
 K (20 students) PP(25) Yr 1/2 (25) Yr 2/3 (24) Yr 3 (25) Yr 4(21) Yr 5(25) Yr 6(25)

The final class structure is dependent on the number of students in each year. While straight year level classes are mostly preferred over composite classes, they are not always possible to create without going over maximum student numbers in classes. Composite classes also allow for greater flexibility when grouping students based on academic and social needs. It is important to note that this structure is based on expected enrolments now. Additional enrolments coming in between now and the start of next year, or students leaving the school, could affect this structure. School staff will be developing class lists based on the above structure. The staff are in the best position to develop the classes and determine which class would most suit students. Academic ability is not a determining factor when staff develop class lists.

***Parents may have additional information that could assist staff in determining class lists. If parents have any information or requests regarding their child's class next year, they should provide this in writing to Ms Jongen. All requests will be considered, but can not be guaranteed. Teachers have not yet been allocated to classes.***

Last night, I announced my departure from Takari Primary School as we welcome back Mrs Amy Carpenter to the Deputy Principal position. It has been an absolute honour to have been part of Takari these past couple of years. I'd like to thank the staff, students and wider community for welcoming me and wish you all the very best for 2023 and the future.

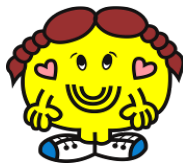

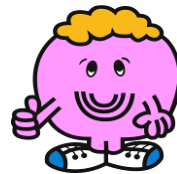

**PARKING AND TRAFFIC AROUND THE SCHOOL:** The city of Stirling has received complaints from residents close to the school in regards to unsafe parking practices occurring around the school and surrounding streets and of drivers not observing general road rules. The City of Stirling will be sending out a Ranger to patrol at drop off and pick up times.

**KISS AND DRIVE:** The 'Kiss and Drive' bays are situated at the front of the school on Rickman Street, outside the library. This is so your children can wait in the shade, on benches outside of the library. Please ensure these bays are used correctly. The last four bays on Rickman Street should only be used to drop off and pick up children while you are still in the car. There is also a one minute limit with these bays. Parents parking and leaving their cars for more than one minute risk a fine. The other bays along Rickman Street have a 15 minute time limit between the hours of 7.30 - 9.00am and 2.30 - 4.15pm.

**USING THE CROSSING WARDEN:** The school is fortunate to have the services of a crossing warden. Unfortunately, it has been reported many children (and parents) are not utilising this service and crossing at the roundabout or near the oval, both less than 40 metres from the official crossing. Please use the services of the Cross Walk man to ensure the safety of your children.

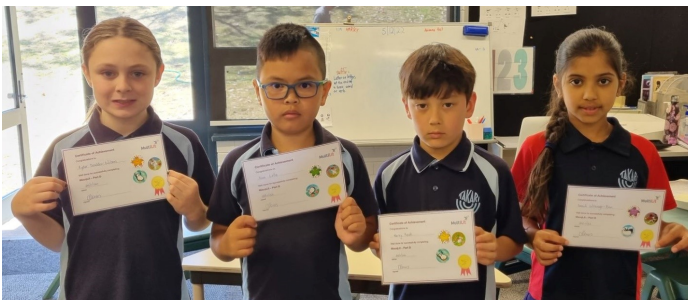
